International Co-Chairs Report

Many great initiatives are happening within Gestalt therapy community around the world. One of them is the AAGT Bud Feder Scholarship Fund: 2019-2020 Online Series. You will find more information about this initiative in our Newsletter and we would like to invite all Gestalt colleagues in Australia to participate. AAGT Gathering and AGM will be held in Sardinia, Italy in September 2019 so if any of you can participate that will be great. The next AAGT Conference is in Ireland 2020.

Another amazing project is the research database. The database will have many scholar references in Gestalt therapy which are published in peer-review journals and books. The situation in Europe inspired many Gestalt therapists to organize and fight for our modality. We need to contribute to evidence-based practice and we need to publish academic articles and books. Gestalt therapy community in Europe is well organized especially the EAGT research committee and they currently have many projects. The next EAGT Conference is in Budapest, September 2019.

Also, the International Gestalt Research Conference in Santiago, Chile was hosted by our Gestalt colleagues in May 2019 and the conference was very successful. The next one will be in Hamburg, Germany 2021. Finally, another important contribution and international collaboration we would like to mention is the 2nd edition of the Handbook of Theory, Research and Practice in Gestalt Therapy edited by Philip Brownell. The book is published and available through Cambridge Scholar Publishers. As you can see Gestalt community in Europe and USA is very alive and active. We are still trying to make contacts with Asian Gestalt Community and we hope to succeed in the future.

GESTALT CONFERENCES

The Gathering/Hui was certainly a departure from earlier conference protocols. It was designed to be a process that in my view, in some ways paralleled Lewin's Action Research method and reflected elements of the Unit of Work, along with creative experimentation with music, art and posters. It is interesting to note that upcoming conferences overseas are moving in somewhat of a similar direction. There are lessons to be learned about how to present a shift in emphasis to potential participants in ways that are more connective and engaging.

A brief summary of the phases and intentions follow:

- Acknowledgement of country grounding in the environment.
- The ground of our perceptions exploration of unconscious bias and exclusion.
- Stories of transformation experiences expressed through creative posters.
- *Uncovering catalysts.* Identifying forces for change, with a phenomenological description how catalysts operate.
- *Grappling with dilemmas* identifying constraints to change, forces for sameness. The most common was 'fear' in its many forms.
- Actions in the field projects/actions selected by the large group addressed both catalysts and constraints with small consultant groups presenting the outcomes to the whole community. These were collected to form a statement from the heart to be published in the future.
- Going forward together represented through an emotionally moving placard parade.

The process involved pair work, small groups of various kinds and whole group configurations with the intent to create many opportunities for interpersonal connection and respect diversity. The facilitation of the process was an experiment in itself, formulated over eighteen months of Zoom meetings, with a mix of shared and lead facilitation across sessions, and many collegiate debriefs on site. The convener group in Sydney, operating largely behind the scenes acted in creative and effective ways to the many and various 'blips' in room and resource management, and Q-station liaison.



Now, nearly two months afterwards, it is some relief to regain some time for my other commitments. Yet I believe our intentions and hopes were well met and satisfying enough for all stakeholders. I hope that the momentum created at the Gathering/Hui ripples out in our region.


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
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AAGT Bi-Annual Conference Call for Proposals EDGES OF EXILE AND BELONGING

From the publisher's blurb:

This is a true second edition, so much so that it approaches being a different book. It includes among its new authors some of the most sought-after theorists in contemporary gestalt therapy. There is a section on the philosophy of science, research and research methodology, and one devoted to gestalt therapy and its teaching and research in diverse parts of the world. There is disagreement and critique, for this is not a simple book. It is so packed with information that it serves as both a challenge and a resource. This second edition of the Handbook will take its place as an aid in understanding the evolution of contemporary gestalt therapy and as a guide to the evolving research tradition in gestalt therapy. It rightfully belongs on the shelves of both beginning trainees in gestalt therapy and advanced and experienced practitioners, and certainly represents a resource for practitioner-researchers involved in practice-based research.

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RESEARCH

New paper on Gestalt Therapy Effectiveness published

Abstract: Gestalt therapy (GT) is a humanistic clinical approach. The research concerning the efficacy of this model represents a controversial and quite poorly investigated topic within the general field of psychotherapy effectiveness. An up-to-date review of the studies concerning GT efficacy is currently lacking. Therefore, we conducted a systematic review of all available studies in the past twelve years aiming to give an overview of the most important findings of empirical researches published in international peer review journals in English and Italian languages. A total of 11 studies were included in this re- view. GT intervention was shown to especially improve conduct in the group therapy setting-not only for clinical disorders, but also related to other social issues. Findings allow suggesting certain reflections concerning future directions in GT research.

Exploring the Root of Development Trauma

According to the traditional perspective on the development of trauma in the first y of a baby's life, the parent initiates what is thought to become an habitual traumatic reaction in the child.

Consequently, the baby reacts to the parent in ways that are rigid and repetitive. Th understanding of developmental trauma, however, does not take into consideration relational dynamics that are part and parcel of any organizing experience. Observin baby and parent interactions from a relational and contextual perspective and throu micro-movements, it can be seen how the baby's behaviors can powerfully impact tl parents and can generate the threat of re-traumatizing for them.

This 75 minute **Interactive and Experiential WEBINAR** will center on the transaction patterns of both baby and parent that over time create traumatic attachi and the passage of intergenerational trauma.
