AGM REPORT

On Sunday 13 November 2022 we had a very successful AGM with 13 members present and 14 members submitting proxy presence.

The report from Michelle Sier, the current GANZ President, thanked our outgoing International Chair, Waltraud Reiner, for her energy and support. It reviewed the successes we have had in providing platforms of meaningful connection in alignment with our vision to support the visibility, integrity and vitality of Gestalt in Australia and New Zealand. These platforms included professional development opportunities, peer process groups, peer supervision groups, study groups and group supervision at low or no cost to members.

Two motions were passed at this meeting. The first was to forgo annual audits as they are no longer required by Access Canberra for incorporated bodies of our size. The second was a change to the constitution Clause 35: Council Members Expenses. This clause now reads There shall be no reimbursement to council members for attending the Biennial Conference". The words any General Meeting" have been deleted from the original wording to allow GANZ Council members to meet in person each year and claim the costs.

Membership increased by close to %100.

Tony Jackson from Gestalt Therapy Australia provided one hour of interactive professional development (accredited for CPD points) at the meeting, on the subject of hope in therapy.
